Stir up your power, O Lord....

On Advent Sundays, our prayer of the day begins with these words: Stir up your power, O Lord...

Advent is the season of waiting; and this year we've gotten either very good or very frustrated with waiting—or both! Only in entertainment do we have instant gratification—no more need to wait for prime time to start at 8 p.m. or for the movie theatre to release a film...just jump on a streaming platform and hours of entertainment await you. But in the rest of our lives, we wait... we wait for packages to come. We wait for our Kroger order pick-up time to arrive. We wait for the host to let us into a zoom meeting. We waited for election results longer than we're used to. We wait for the weekly update to see what will happen with our schools. We wait to see family and friends. We wait to be in worship together. We wait for a vaccine.

We wait ... and as we wait, we pray, "God, help us!". Help us to hang in there. Help us to cope with disappointments. Help us to cope with grief that comes from missing milestones and occasions. Help us who have older parents and loved ones in care facilities. Help us who have no money for rent. Help us who have loved ones in prison. Help us!

Remind us that you are here with us, cheering us on as we help our neighbors, crying with us when we are exhausted and overwhelmed, rejoicing to hear our voices raised in thankfulness, hearing us as we call out our needs. Stir up in us a willingness to help our neighbor, to be Christ to each other. Stir up in us a sense of your great love for us and provide us with a will and with opportunities to share that love with others.

Spiritual Growth

WORSHIP REMINDER

While Lucas County is "red", as designated by the Ohio Department of Health, St. Stephen will be worshipping on-line together at 11:00 each Sunday. We're working to have our YouTube channel stream the worship in real time, as Facebook Live does. The worship service is available on each platform throughout the week, as well.

ADVENT WORSHIP

On December 2, 11, and 16, we'll gather by Zoom for a time of music, quiet, and reflection as we wait for the birth of Jesus. We'll be sending out the Zoom code for this 7:00 worship service through our One Call Now app. Please join us as we prepare for Christmas in a new way!

WALK-UP COMMUNION

We continue to hold Communion each Wednesday from 3-6 p.m. With the cold, we have moved up the sidewalk so that those who are communing are standing between the double entry doors, while Pastor Beth is in the narthex itself.

CHRISTMAS EVE WORSHIP SERVICE OPPORTUNITIES

We will have 2 Christmas Eve worship opportunities at St. Stephen this year. At 5:00 p.m., a Christmas eve worship will be livestreamed on Facebook and YouTube. It will feature Christmas music and a sermon by Pastor Beth. You will be able to view this worship service at any time (after 5:00 p.m.) on Christmas eve and day. At 6:00 p.m. (weather permitting), we're planning to hold an outdoor Christmas carol service. Standing around a bonfire, wearing masks and social distancing, we'll gather outside to sing some Christmas carols together and to hear the Christmas story from Luke's gospel. We'll light candles and sing Silent Night together before heading in different directions. Depending on the weather, this service will last from 10 to 25 minutes. (If it's nice we'll sing more, if not, we'll sing less). A similar outdoor caroling service will be held at Olivet Lutheran at 5:00 p.m. You're invited to attend either outdoor service as it fits with your plans that evening. (The outdoor service will not be live-streamed)

CHRISTMAS DAY WORSHIP

A worship service will be available on Christmas Day for viewing on our Facebook page and YouTube channel. Members of our synod contributed to the worship, which celebrates Mary's Magnificat, as well as the 50th anniversary of the ordination of women in the ELCA.

A LIGHT IN THE PARK

While Advent is a season of hope and Christmas is a season of joy, not everyone feels hopeful or like celebrating. Grief, illness, aging, depression, loneliness, unemployment, and loss (especially this year) are magnified. This "Light in the Park" service is intended to provide a time and a place of solace during the business of preparing for Christmas. We come together seeking healing and room to share grief, sadness, loneliness or confusion when these emotions often feel out of place during the holidays. You're invited to gather with the whole community at Burnham Park on December 20th from 2-4 p.m. St. Stephen, Olivet Lutheran, and Sylvania First United Methodist churches are sponsoring this worship opportunity. At the park, there will be 4 stations where people can go, pray, and light candles, while wearing masks and observing social distancing. You can come and go at your own pace any time during this time frame.

2020 Quilting for LWR

Our special thanks go to our leader from the inception of this project, through February of 2020, Mary Ann Klimesh. When we started, Mary Ann was the only one who actually knew how to make quilts. She taught us everything we know and spent countless hours between work days, preparing materials, learning more to share with us. She also finished many of the quilts herself. Thank you, Mary Ann for your patience and encouragement. We also thank Don Klimesh, who made our special ironing table and the wood lifts for our worktables.

Thanks to all the kind and dedicated people who participated in the quilting project, our statistics

for 2020 are:

44 quilts for Lutheran World Relief (LWR) were finished between January and September and delivered to the LWR ingathering site near Pemberville, Ohio on October 10th. 8 more were in process for the rest of this year and next at that time as well.

18 St. Stephen Lutheran Church members and 5 friends contributed time, talent, fabrics/supplies/ or Thrivent Action Team money to the project. The Thrivent Action Team \$250 gift cards help purchase the sheets used for backings and the battings for the quilts.



2,112 11-inch squares were used to make the 44 quilt tops. Each quilt takes 48 squares, 1 twin flat sheet and a twin size batting.

The entire process of making a quilt takes approximately 12 hours.

The narthex, fellowship hall, 2 storerooms and 3 Sunday school rooms were utilized this year, to maintain safe distances and work efficiently.

Some work was done by members at home or while visiting. Several boxes of fabric squares came to us from Texas and one quilt top was sewn in Indianapolis, IN.

Several quilters sewed masks for friends, family and front-line workers during the time we were unable to meet.

One member made a huge stack of school bags for LWR from our donated fabrics too heavy for quilting, during the shut-down.

We would also like to thank the second service gentlemen who helped us set up for workdays in January and February and to Pastor Beth, for letting us leave our work areas set up between workdays.


