A lot has happened since the publication of our last newsletter. In the midst of two unprecedented events, the Covid-19 pandemic and the economic/unemployment crisis, we saw rallies and protests following the death of George Floyd in Minneapolis. There is much to think about, much to pray about. For this month's column, I invite you to read the words of our ELCA Bishop, Elizabeth Eaton, written on June 5th, as she too reflects on these events.

"Out of my distress I called on the Lord" (Psalm 118:5).

We are a nation in distress. We are a church in distress. The coronavirus has killed 103,000 of us. The virus of racism has taken hundreds of thousands more throughout our history. Now these two deadly viruses converge. Under this distress the veneer of equality has cracked and we see the pain, anger and frustration of those who have been denied the rights and dignity so many of us expect and often take for granted.

I have heard it said that slavery ended with the Civil War. Why don't people of color "just get over it." Here is the question we need to ask, "How do you get over something that isn't over?" The extrajudicial killings of Ahmaud Arbery, Breonna Taylor and George Floyd that we have seen have laid open the wound in our country that has never been fully dealt with and has never healed. The officer's knee suffocating the life out of George Floyd "reminds us that blatant acts of intimidation, hatred, and violence continue" (Freed in Christ social statement, page 3).

Continued peaceful protests, vigils and demonstrations are not only legitimate but essential to move this country and this church to honest and deep self-examination. Just as the body of Christ is COVID positive, so is the body of Christ infected with racism and white supremacy. We cannot turn away from this truth. To deny it is dishonest and dangerous.

Let us stand with those peacefully protesting and acting responsibly. Looting and destruction of property does not further the cause of justice. Government has a role to uphold civil order while also a role to respect peaceful protest. There are those in law enforcement who are acting wisely, even while others have acted irresponsibly. I ask you to support the many people, including those in our church, who are working to deescalate tensions between law enforcement, protesters and the community.

Psalm 118 continues: "I thank you that you have answered me and have become my salvation. The stone that the builders rejected has become the chief cornerstone. This is the Lord's doing; it is marvelous in our eyes. This is the day that the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it" (21-24). Christ, the cornerstone, has already broken down the wall that divides us. The time is now. This is the day.

Spiritual Growth

JULY WORSHIP PLANS

We will be offering a drive-in worship service on July 12 and July 26 (weather permitting). You will be asked to park, facing the church building, with an empty parking space between you and the next car. You're welcome to remain in your car, following along with the bulletin provided earlier in the week, for the duration of worship. You may choose to bring a lawn chair from home and place it in front of your car grill for worship. We ask that you wear a cloth face covering if you leave your car and that you keep 6 feet away from others. The building will not be open for your use, so please plan accordingly.

These drive-in worship services will be livestreamed on Facebook and will be available, as usual, on Facebook and our YouTube channel for viewing later. Our worship on July 5 and July 19 are planned to be an online only option. However, if the weather is not cooperating, we will slide our "drive-in" worship to the next Sunday. (For example, if it is raining on July 12, our drive-in worship will be held on July 19). Any postponements due to weather will be determined by Saturday afternoon and announced on Facebook and through our One Call Now.

WALK-UP COMMUNION

Walk-up Communion is offered outside under our covered walkway on Wednesdays from 3-6 p.m. for households that have been quarantining together. We are communing using wafers, and a choice of wine or grape juice, which have been prepared in a safe manner. A bulletin and instructions are available on our website under the Resources tab. This 5-7 minute service features Confession and Forgiveness, as well as Holy Communion. It is also designed to provide physical distancing. The service is very similar to how communion is shared with folks in the hospital and those unable to come to worship. If these times don't work for you or your family, please contact Pastor Beth to make alternate arrangements.

We will be hosting Sunday Worship online at 11:00 a.m. while Ohio is in phase 1 and safety procedures are in place. 

GIVE PLUS

During this pandemic, we are offering information on how to take advantage of new ways to continue our commitment to God and His church. With social distancing and limited abilities to come together to worship at church, our ability to contribute to St. Stephen has been impacted. For those members who are comfortable with using new technologies to contribute, Vanco Services provides us with a smart phone app that we can use to make our donations. This is the same company we process our Simply Giving donations through. Select the Vanco Give Plus+ app to download.



If you have never used the app before, you need to first identify what church you want to contribute to. Entering 43560 in the zip code for this screen will bring up a list of available churches in Sylvania.

Select St. Stephen Lutheran Church from the list of available options.

On the screen, you can create an account or continue as guest. The rest of these steps are done as a guest.

Click on the '+' sign at the top of the screen to begin making a contribution.

Select the frequency of donation for single or multiple donations and select a pre-defined amount (\$25, \$50, or \$100) or enter your own amount on the line and click on the "Add" button.

Confirm that the information matches what you want for the dollar amount and frequency of donation. If you want to change your contribution, click on the garbage can icon.

Once everything is correct for your donation, click on the "Next" button.

Enter your banking and address information. Note these will be saved for future donations so you will not have to re-enter this information if you choose to continue to use the app You should see a confirmation page with confirmation number and amount of your donation for your records.

Thanks to John Lock for testing this and documenting the steps to follow.

SIMPLY GIVING

Since we have not been able to worship in our church building, getting our weekly donation in to church is not easy. Why not enroll now and you won't have to think about remembering to do so. You can set up deductions from your checking or savings account in either weekly, semi-monthly, or monthly amounts; and it is never taken out earlier than you specify even if a holiday falls on your regular specified date. In this case it will be taken out the next business day after the holiday. See me for an application.

BUILDING AND COVID INFORMATION

Our Property Chairman, Joe Kahl, met with Hoffman & Harpst, our HVAC contractor to review our building's air handling systems for compliance with COVID safety regulations. All HVAC systems have been determined to have appropriate outside air intake. The majority of our air filtration systems exceed standards, with one unit needing minor upgrading. According to new industry standard, ultra violet light installation eliminates the vast majority of airborne viruses, however it is so new that installation costs are prohibitive.


